



NUNAVUT PLANNING COMMISSION FINAL AGENDAS FOR UPCOMING REGIONAL PUBLIC HEARINGS 2021 DRAFT NUNAVUT LAND USE PLAN

Date: July 22, 2022

On June 2, 2022 the Nunavut Planning Commission (NPC or Commission) distributed *Draft* Agendas for the upcoming in-person Regional Public Hearings in respect of the 2021 Draft Nunavut Land Use Plan (DNLUP). As part of the correspondence, the NPC requested that participants provide the Commission with confirmation of their planned attendance, including comments or suggestions on the *Draft* Agendas and any specific logistical arrangements required during the Public Hearings. On or before June 30, 2022 the NPC received comments and suggested revisions to the *Draft* Agenda from the following participants:

The NPC has considered the changes and revisions to the *Draft* Agendas proposed by participants in their correspondence and has updated the agendas to provide greater time allocation and flexibility during the proceedings. NPC Response to NTI/QIA Request for Virtual Participation

The NPC has considered the comments and recommendations of participants including Nunavut Tunngavik Incorporated (NTI) and Qikiqtani Inuit Association (QIA) requesting for the Public Hearings to be held in a hybrid format with a combination of in-person and virtual participation. After further consideration of the issue and additional research into the support required to facilitate such a process, the Commission unfortunately does not have the resources to provide for full virtual participation at each of the 5 hearings. The Commission will be live streaming the Public Hearings as outlined below.

NPC Response to NWB Request for Additional Evening Sessions for NWB related Matters

The NPC has also considered the request of the Nunavut Water Board (NWB) to lead an evening session to discuss and receive feedback on the development of the Nunavut Water Management Strategy from the communities and participants attending the NPC's Public Hearings. Unfortunately, the Commission is unable to accommodate the NWB request as the NPC may also have to conduct evening sessions.

NPC Response to NTI Request to have Elders Speak at the NPC Hearings

The NPC understands NTI's request, and from the outset has encouraged municipalities and HTOs to appoint a broad range of community representatives including elders, youth, and women to attend the Public Hearings and share their comments or concerns on the 2021 DNLUP. The NPC fully appreciates the breadth of knowledge that Elders have and has made the agenda flexible to accommodate their input through the selected community representatives during the proceedings. In addition, as outlined below, the NPC has provided time in the agenda for members of the public, including Elders, who wish to present evidence to do so by advising the Chairperson at the hearings.

PROCEDURAL EXPECTATIONS & KEY HIGHLIGHTS OF THE 2022 PUBLIC HEARINGS

The Public Hearings are an opportunity for participants to provide feedback on the 2021 DNLUP directly to Commissioners. The core expectations from the Public Hearings are that:

- Participants will have the opportunity to present the gaps identified through parties' review of the 2021 DNLUP including Options and Recommendation Document and associated maps.
- Participants will express their concerns and identify items or parts of the 2021 DNLUP that they support or not support, and why?
- Participants will provide recommendations to the NPC to address the identified gaps and concerns.

Should Parties wish to rely on materials that are not already available on the NPC's Public Registry, they should be prepared to provide paper copies for reference as well as a digital copy to be posted on the Public Registry. Parties should be prepared to speak to whether their comments or questions have been satisfactorily addressed and, if not, to provide clarification as to what issues remain outstanding.



Confirmation of Attendance

At this time, the NPC is also requesting a response from any participant or agencies that have yet to submit the names of individuals to be presenting evidence (technical presentations) to the Commission. The NPC respectfully requests that this information be provided directly to the Commission on or before **August 30, 2022**.

Participation

Participants can attend any of the regional hearings in person in Nunavut or Manitoba with simultaneous **English-Inuktitut-French-Dĕnesuĭliné** interpretation. The NPC has retained the service of a professional Audio/Visual company to stream the proceedings live. These additional broadcasting measures are intended to enable community members to remain aware of issues being discussed through the Public Hearings. Additional information will be provided on how to access this broadcast during the meetings.

Presentations

As a reminder, the NPC previously requested that all parties submit their **English, Inuktitut, and French** presentations to the NPC via email at: submissions@nunavut.ca, on or before **August 12, 2022**. The NPC would like to remind all parties to provide sufficient printed copies of their presentation for the information of attendees at the Public Hearing, noting that up to 100 English copies, 80 Inuktitut copies, and 30 French copies may be necessary.

With respect to the format for participants' presentations, the Commission requests that presentations be organized as follows:

1. Provide a brief overview of the organization's mandate and interest in the planning process and development of the Nunavut Land Use Plan.
2. Present an overview of the concerns or issues that remain outstanding and being brought forward to the Public Hearings for further consideration.
 - This should include a brief summary of the issues identified with the 2021 DNLUP with reference to the document sections and page numbers that the issues are discussed. If the presenting organization had previously submitted documents to the NPC, it is not necessary to read the submission into the record at the hearing.
3. A summary of the conclusion(s) related to the issue, including references to the justification/data/rationale supporting that conclusion. This section could also be used to identify aspects of the 2021 DNLUP that participants support.
4. Recommendations on how the Commission could address the issues.

The Commission request that participants submit their presentations on or before **August 12, 2022**.

The NPC understands that some participants may want to modify their presentations as the Hearing progresses but asks all parties to make their own arrangements for producing hardcopies of presentations for the hearings they plan to attend. **If participant's presentations rely upon speaking notes, the Commission requests the submission of speaking notes and translated versions to aid with interpretation.**

Community Representatives

As you are aware, the Commission has requested the nomination of community representatives from Municipal Councils, Hunters & Trappers Organizations, and other community groups from the Kivalliq, Kitikmeot, Qikiqtaaluk



regions as well as affected Nunavik and Dënesųliné communities in northern Quebec, Manitoba, and Saskatchewan to participate directly in the Public Hearings. The Commission will cover the cost of travel, accommodations and provide standard per-diem rates to for meals and incidentals for these community representatives to allow for their attendance and participation at the Regional Public Hearings. A significant portion of time will be made available to community representatives to ask questions and provide comments for the Commission's consideration.

The NPC will be holding a brief information meeting for representatives the day before the Public Hearings to prepare representatives for participation in the Public Hearing.

Inuit Tradition and Oral Communication

The Commission assures all participants, including the affected communities that in conducting these hearings, the Commission will give great weight to Inuit tradition regarding oral communication and decision-making and will accord to the designated Inuit organizations **full standing** to appear at the public hearings for the purpose of making submissions on behalf of Inuit. In addition, there is no requirement for any participant to provide submissions or comments in writing, and all oral communication during the hearings will be fully considered.

Time Allotted for Parties to Present Evidence

Participants will be granted **30 minutes** to present evidence to the Commissioners followed by **20 minutes** for questions and responses from the Commission and other participants. The Government of Canada, Government of Nunavut, Nunavut Tunngavik Incorporated, Makivik Corporation, Ghotelnene K'odtineh Dënesųliné and Athabasca Dënesųliné are limited to 60 minutes each for their presentation, after which there is 30 minutes for questions and responses.

PUBLIC HEARING LOGISTICS
