To submit a project proposal to the NPC, the proponent will need to register an account on our online portal. Please note that the online system is not supported by Google Chrome. You will need to use:



The following information is required for an NPC project proposal application, by tab (see Appendix 1):


Project Overview:

- Specify if this project is **NEW** or an **AMENDMENT/RENEWAL** to a previous one
 - **Be sure to include any past permits, licenses, file numbers (issued by the Nunavut Impact Review Board [NIRB], Nunavut Water Board [NWB], NPC, etc.)**
- Project name
- Start and end dates, annual or seasonal work
- Estimated number of people/days on site
- Project description, outlining the following:
 - o The project activities, their necessity and duration including the timing of the project including any long term developments
 - Number of people involved
 - Method of air and/or ground transportation
 - o Type of equipment to be used
 - Type of fuel to be used and storage method(s)
 - Describe any structures that will be erected (permanent/temporary) including any camps and associated structures, docks, piers, and/or airstrips
 - o Type of local resources to be used including local accommodation(s)
 - Location of the project to the nearest community(ies) (include distance(s) to communities)
 - Location of the project to sensitive areas including archaeological sites, national/territorial parks and/or bird sanctuaries
 - o A brief history of the site if known
 - Any alternatives considered
 - Summary of any community consultation conducted including a summary of concerns expressed and strategies employed to address any concerns.

ADDITIONAL NOTES:

• All of these fields may not require any information as it is based on the land uses the proponent chooses for the work or activity being proposed. However, fields must be filled in and include text. Under the Material Uses tab, Equipment, Fuel Use, and Hazardous Materials and Chemicals Use must be filled in. Example: If the application does not require fuel, input the following:



- The NPC has up to 45 days to review the project proposal and issue a decision. Depending on the type of work you propose, it is possible that the project proposal will have to be screened by the NIRB, which takes an additional 45 days after the proposal is submitted to them.
- If any past permits, licenses, file numbers (including NIRB, NWB, or NPC) are associated with the works/activities you are applying for, include them.
- Once the NPC issues a decision, proponents must contact the NIRB and/or the identified authorizing agencies to provide additional
 information that may be required by those organizations.

HELPFUL HINTS:

- Right-click copy and paste does not work in LUPIT. To copy information into/out of LUPIT, the proponent must use their keyboard shortcut.
 - o To copy into textbox: CTRL + C
 - o To paste into textbox: CTRL + V
- If the works/activities include prospecting and confidentiality is preferred, the proponent must put in a request to the NPC. Terms of the confidentiality should also be included. Then, the NPC will review and consider the request.
- Under the Project Map tab: if the proponent prefers to draw a polygon or polyline as their geometry, to complete the drawing, double-click.
